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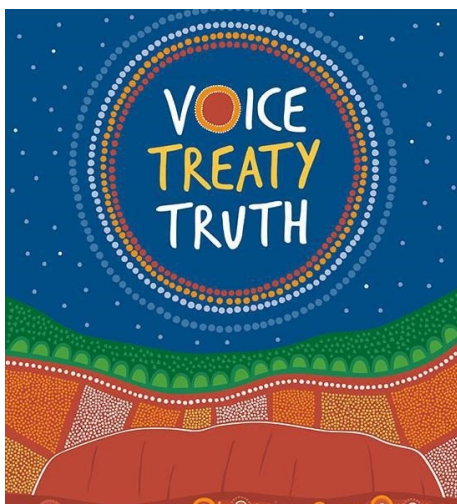

Raffy Mac Hamblin was born last Friday.

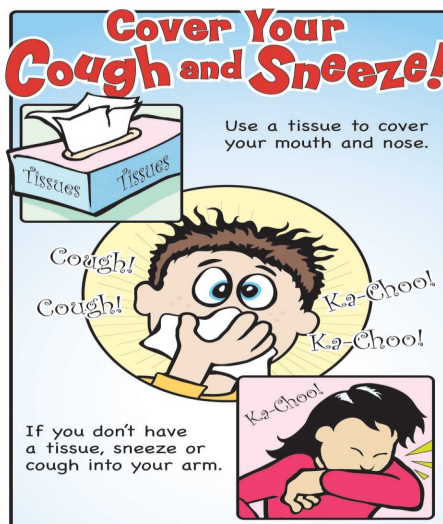

Learning about Papua New Guinea in 3/4L

This term, our class have been learning about Papua New Guinea for a special event happening on Thursday 27th June.



On Monday 24th June, we were lucky enough to have Walfrieda Angmai (the mother of Elizabeth in our class) come in to talk to us about her life in Papua New Guinea. Walfrieda and Elizabeth come from a village in the Mandang Province of Papua New Guinea.

The class enjoyed learning about the roles of the males and females in the tribe and some of the special customs that they follow to keep the culture alive. Women are expected to cook, clean, garden and teach their roles to their daughters/granddaughters. Men are expected to know how to build houses, fish, hunt and garden. We learnt that men also inherit the land of the family.



The Mandang Province is known for their beautiful handmade bags called bilums and unique clay pots. Walfrieda described in detail how bilums are made, including the preparation of the string by soaking pineapple leaves in the salt water for many months and twisting the fibres. The class also enjoyed learning about the uses of these bags, including holding food and even babies.

3/4L are very excited to present their Papua New Guinea projects to the Country Women's Association of Euberta on Thursday.

Nutrition Snippet

The simplest way

... to make baked veggie chips

Serves: 4 | Prep time: 15 min | Cooking time: 20 min

Ingredients

- 1 sweet potato, peeled
- 2 carrots, peeled
- 2 parsnips, peeled
- 1 large beetroot, peeled
- Sprigs of fresh rosemary or thyme
- Olive oil spray
- Sea salt



Method

Pre-heat oven to 190°C. Slice all the vegies into thin rounds. Spread them out on paper towels and blot dry, ensure they're as dry as possible.

Line a baking tray with foil and lightly spray with olive oil. Spread the vegies and herbs on the tray and spray them with olive oil and add a dash of salt. Bake for approx. 20 minutes, checking every 5 mins. to ensure they're not burning. Remove any that are brown and crispy before the others.

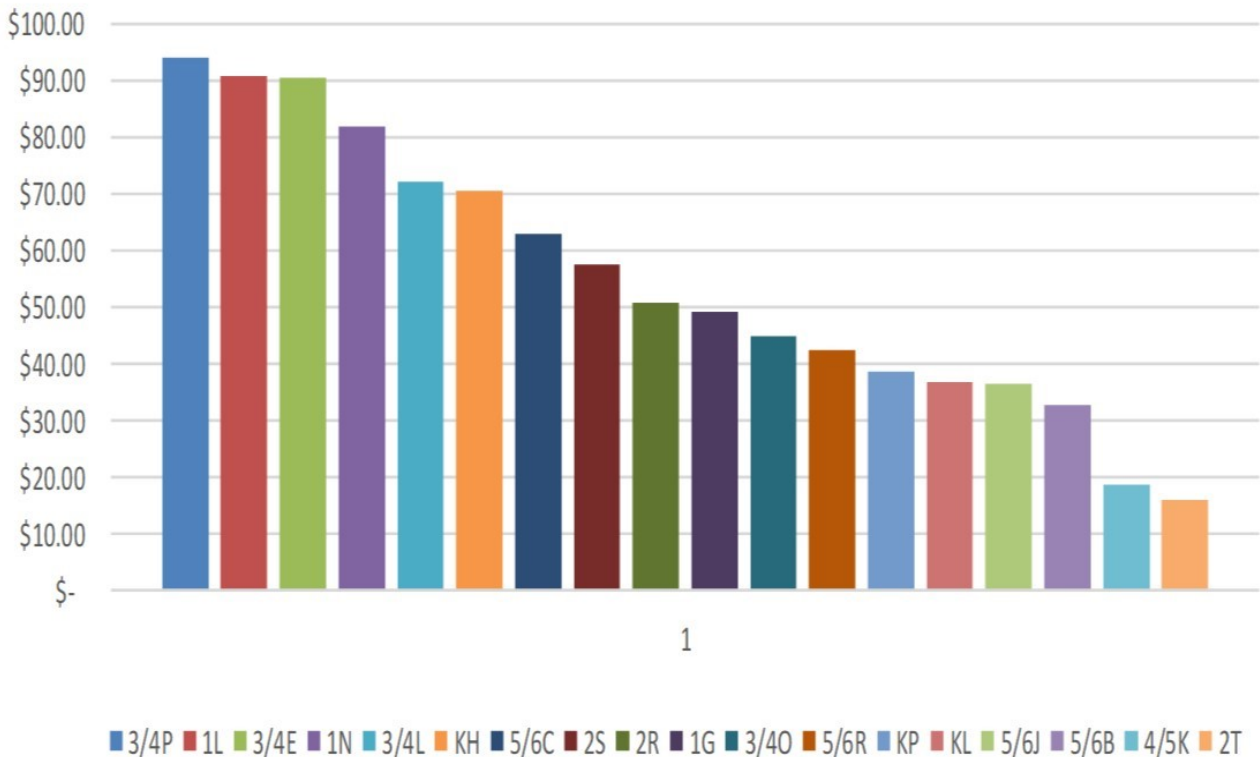
